The Heitmann [atelier & gallery] opened in Dec. of 2008 and specializes in fine arts exhibitions by Pennsylvania's emerging artists. Owner Cassi Heitmann earned her BFA in 2008 from Kutztown University. The opening of this gallery is a result of her search for personal studio space in Lancaster City. Cassi's work explores the human tendency of creating visual models to explain broader abstract ideas. Located on Chestnut Street just off N. Penn Square Grille

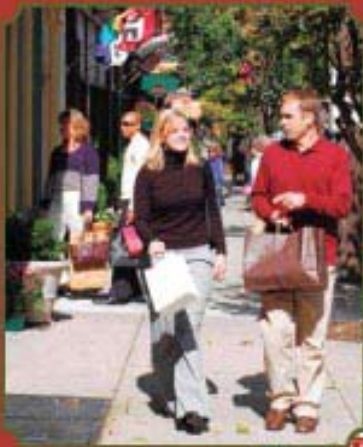
