Celebrate Lancaster! and celebrate Lancaster Pride

The warm weather of summer is upon us — and it's the perfect time to head outside for some fun in the city.

■ Don't miss Lancaster's **Pride Festival & Celebration**, scheduled for Saturday, June 18 at Buchanan Park.

The festival turns the park into a carnival this year, complete with jugglers, mimes, street performers, face painting and a dunk tank. Three stages host entertainment throughout the day, including live music, dancing and drag queens and kings. Among the performers are Kris Margiotta and The Rebel Alliance, members of the cast of "Chicago" from Ephrata Performing Arts Center, the Joyful Noise Choir, The Darkes Band, members of the casts of "The Wizard of Oz" and "The Drowsy Chaperone" from the Dutch Apple and Vin Fischer. Vendors will offer everything from art and jewelry to Pride items and food. This family friendly day also includes a Kid's Corner for the young and young-at-heart.

Lancaster Pride runs noon to 6 p.m. Admission is \$5; kids under 12 are free.

■ On Friday, June 24, you can toast the cultural diversity of Lancaster with **Celebrate Lancaster!**, held along North Queen Street.

"We have a fantastic lineup of music ranging from reggae to salsa, bluegrass to blues. We've added a new stage of entertainment at Penn Square and extended the hours of the event," says Baker. "The entertainment runs 5 to 10 p.m., with the fireworks finale at 10."

Among the entertainers are Sonora Los Fantasticos, Nation Beat and The Holmes Brothers.

Food vendors will be serving up their specialties beginning at 11:30 a.m., until 10 p.m.

"There's also a huge variety in our food vendors this year, including Indian, Italian, Thai, barbecue, Caribbean, plus traditional foods like crab cakes, French fries, ice cream and much more," Baker says. "Also new this year are two pub areas where those that are old enough can purchase and enjoy locally crafted beer and wine."
